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From the Principal's Desk

As one of the leading institutions of higher education in Darrang district, Sipajhar College has come a long way since its inception in 1971. The need for an institution of higher education in Sipajhar was keenly felt by the intellectuals of the area as many talented youngsters of the area had to abandon their dreams of higher education owing to financial constraints. Lack of availability of sufficient government land for setting up a college was a stumbling block which was overcome by the large-hearted and generous people of the area who came forward to donate their agricultural land for setting up the college. Situated at an easily accessible location along the National Highway 52, the College has been able to provide a sustainable momentum to the efforts to provide quality education to the student community of the area. From its humble beginnings in the Diamond Club premises and teachers with virtually no salary, Sipajhar College has come a long way. Starting out with just Pre-University classes in 1971 and Degree Classes in 1980, Sipajhar College, which celebrated its Silver Jubilee in 1997 has contributed significantly to the academic and cultural life of the region. With its alumni adorning responsible and respectable positions in society the college has been able to fulfil most of what it set out to do. Sipajhar College has also been rendering yeoman service in the sphere of women education, an area in which it was lagging behind before its establishment. Permanently affiliated to the Gauhati University the college was brought under the Deficit Grant in Aid system of the Government of Assam in 1986 and was registered under 2(f) and 12B of the UGC in 1996.The college was "provincialised" by the Government of Assam on 22nd December by The Assam College Employees' (Provincialisation) Act, 2005

Subject combination options are open for other subjects.

SELECTION FOR MAJOR COURSES

There are limited number of seats available for major course of study in each department. Merit will be the sole criteria in allotting major in any department and seats will be filled on first-come-first-served basis as per merit list on the day of admission. However, the selection test shall be conducted by the Selection Committee of the Department within fifteen days from the commencement of the classes. Once seats are filled no claims will be entertained.

Note

There will be six semesters covering 3 years

Greater emphasis will be given on Internal Assessment.

Students taking English as their major subject are not allowed to take Alternative English as per Gauhati University rules.

Students taking Assamese as their major subject are not allowed to take M.I.L. as per Gauhati University rules

DISTANCE AND OPEN LEARNING

Sipajhar College provides facilities and opportunities under the Distance and Open Learning System. The college is a partner institute of Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU) and offers regular weekend classes for various courses. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

The College prospectus and application form for admission to the college will be available to students at the college office. The dates for submission of forms and interview for admission will be notified on the college notice board and in the local dailies. Admission is on the basis of merit but a few seats are reserved for the physically challenged students and for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC/MOBC as per Govt. rules. A few seats are also earmarked for students having extraordinary competence in sports, culture and community service.

Student Support Services

The latest in educational facilities and opportunities are provided here including access to

Internet. Teaching aids such as OHPs, LCD projectors, Computers and Microphones have been made available to all the departments.

A new Language Lab has been set up under the aegis of the Department of English with UGC assistance under Teaching-Aids Scheme of the XI Plan. The Language Lab has the latest facilities for imparting training in developing language



skills. The **Lab** is equipped with 15 computers which are LAN networked and also provided with Internet connectivity.

Information cum Career Guidance and Counselling Cell (ICGC) is a student welfare service aimed at providing the students with guidance and counselling to cope with personal and social problems and to provide wide exposure to career opportunities. The cell organises awareness programmes for personality development and workshops to provide information on career avenues and prospects.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

Established in 1993 to inculcate social consciousness and a sense of responsibility, discipline and dignity of labour among the youth the National Service Scheme (NSS) is a voluntary organisation of college students under the Union Ministry of Human Resource Development. Students can enrol themselves in the NSS unit of the college at the

beginning of the academic session. The college unit of the NSS takes up a number of social service programmes with active participation of the people of the locality.

Bharat Scouts and Guides

The Unit of Bharat Scouts and Guides was constituted in Sipajhar College in 2006. Since then, it has been rendering a fruitful service to the college participating in all its auspicious occasions. Besides, the unit also involves itself in different occasions and activities arranged by the State as well as the Central Government.



Students' Aid Fund

The college has an aid fund that provides financial assistance to the economically backward meritorious students. An application accompanied by the income certificate of the parents from a competent authority must be submitted to the Principal of the college for consideration of aid.

Awards and Prizes:

The college has a "Best Graduate" award for the best all-round-performance from amongst the final year students of the college. Besides all the students securing CGPA10 in the university final examination from the college will also be suitably rewarded by the college authorities. The Purnakanta Hazarika Memorial Award of Rs. 2000 instituted since 2006 is given annually to the student who secures the highest marks in History(major) in the university final examination from the college. The Dr Sarada Nair Memorial awards will be given to the student getting highest marks in English major from the college in two categories- 1st Class (Rs 2000) and 2nd Class Rs 1000 from the current year. The Department of Political Science offers a cash award of Rs 1000 to all the students securing 1st Class in the university final examination.






Red Ribbon Club (RRC)

Sipajhar College has a "Red Ribbon Club" functioning under the aegis of the Assam State Aids Control Society (ASACS), Khanapara. The main purpose of the club is to create awareness among the students on the necessity of voluntary blood donation, blood testing, blood grouping, AIDS, HIV avoidance of intoxicants etc. The club also offers counselling and advice on preventive measures. Membership for students is free and voluntary.

Library

The Sipajhar College Library has around twelve thousand books, several national and local newspapers and more than two dozen journals, both national and international. It

follows the open access system with books being lent out through requisition slips. The process of library automation, installing OPAC (On-line Public Access Catalogue) and acquiring access to INFLIBNET services is underway. Besides providing internet facilities the library users also have access to reprographic services and photocopies of resources available in the library and reference section.



Working hours of the library: 10 am to 4 pm Rules and Regulations

Books will be issued as per schedule prepared by the Librarian

Books are issued for 15 days and renewed for another 15 days.

Thereafter a fine of 1 rupee per day will be realised.

Personal books are not allowed inside the library.

There are two reading rooms, one for the students and the other for the teachers.

Departmental Library- All the departments of the college have well- stocked departmental libraries for the use of students having major in the concerned subject.

WOMEN'S HOSTEL

A full-fledged Women's Hostel having all modern amenities has been functioning for



the last decade and offers accommodation for girls. The number of seats are limited and are allotted on merit basis. However women coming from places with inadequate transport and communication facilities are given priority. A separate form for admission to the hostel, obtainable from the hostel warden on the day of college admission, is to be filled and submitted to the warden at the time of admission.

Rules and Regulations for boarders of the Women's Hostel

- 1 Boarders must pay their monthly mess dues on time.
- 2 No Boarder shall leave the hostel without prior permission from the hostel superintendent.
- 3 Visitors are allowed to meet the a boarder only during visiting hours and in the visiting room.
- 4 All hostel property like furniture, utensils, electrical appliances etc should be treated properly and in the event of any damage the matter should be brought to the notice of the superintendent immediately.
- 5 Use of unauthorised electrical appliances such as heaters and irons are strictly prohibited.
- 6 Expulsion from the college hostel implies expulsion from the college and vice versa.
- 7 The hostel will remain closed during all vacations.
- 8 A student may stay as a hostel guest during examinations, with prior permission from the hostel superintendent. Such a guest can stay for not more than a month and she will have to pay Rs 200 as seat rent to the college.
- 9 Any student staying in the hostel for more than a month will be treated as a regular boarder.

Women's Cell: The college has a functioning Women's Cell that works in close coordination with the Women's Study Centre of Gauhati University. The cell observes the International Women's Day (8th March); World Environment Day(5th June); World Literacy Day (September) and World AIDS Day (1st December) every year. Besides conducting health camps and workshops the cell also arranges lectures on women's health issues by leading health practitioners.

Students' Union

The college students' union is an elected body of the students. The union body is entrusted with the responsibility of organising the Fresher's Social and College Week. The college authority provides assistance and co-operation to the Student's Union in all its activities.

Uniform

Coffee-coloured salwar and dupatta with beige coloured kurta for girls and coffee coloured

pants with beige coloured shirt for boys is the prescribed uniform of the college for its students.

Students' Identity Card

The college identity card is issued to the students at the time of admission. The duly filled in identity card authenticated by the signature of the principal of the college is to be carried by all students. In case of any loss or damage to the card the matter should be immediately reported to the principal and a duplicate will be issued on payment of the prescribed fee.

Co-Curricular Activities

Games & Sports: Built with UGC assistance under the XI Plan the college has an Indoor Sports Training Centre with state-of- the- art- equipment. It provides facilities for indoor sports and games.

College Magazine

A college magazine is published annually to provide avenues for the expression of the literary talents of its students and is a useful record of all important college activities. Wall magazines are also brought out by all the departments of the college annually and by the Student Union twice a year.

Students' Travelling Concession

Students of the college are entitled to concessions on travel home and back during vacation, for travelling on academic tours organised by the college and for travel in connection with college activities.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The reconstituted IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell) of Sipajhar College has taken up implementation of the UGC recommended **Performance Based Self Appraisal**

System. The IQAC of the college would give access to the **Work-Load**, **Teaching Plan**, **Unit Test Schedule**, **Action-taken-report on Teaching Plans** and **Annual Plans** of all the teachers of the college to any guardians wanting to do so. The IQAC has instituted a "Best Department Award" from the current session and involves the participation of all the stakeholders of the college.

Code of Conduct

- It is mandatory for the students to come to the college in the prescribed uniform and to carry identity cards at all times Indulging in ragging in any form inside and outside the college is strictly prohibited. Any student found doing so will be dealt with as per directives of the Courts.
- Students are strictly prohibited from damaging college property. The cost of any such damage will be recovered from the student/guardian.
- The college campus is a No Smoking, No Tobacco, No Plastic, No Alcohol, No Drugs zone.
- The use of Mobile Phones inside the college campus is strictly prohibited and phones used inside the college will be confiscated.
- All students should read the notice board regularly.
- Minimum attendance of 75% is mandatory for appearing in the Council and University examinations. Students remaining absent for more than 5 days at a stretch will have their names struck off the attendance registers. To get their names re-entered in the register an application addressed to the HOD countersigned by the guardian and supported by a medical certificate will be considered. Poor attendance will also invite fines as fixed by the college authorities.


